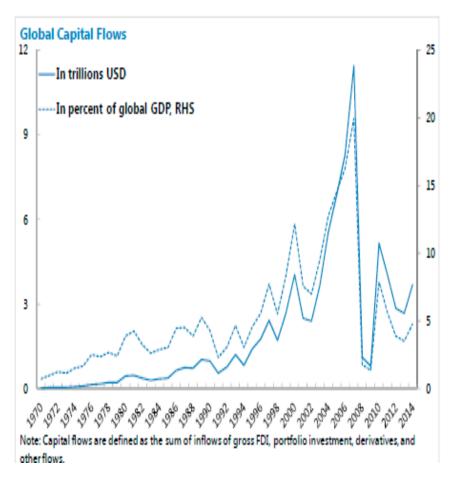

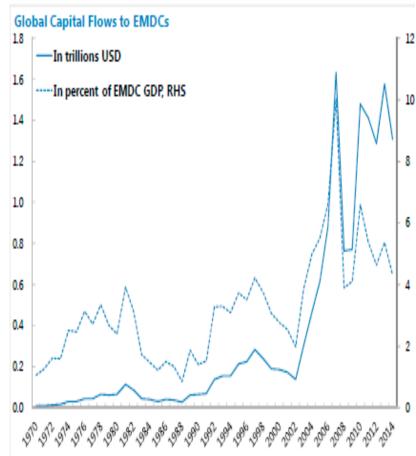

Capital Flows to Emerging and Developing Countries (% to GDP)

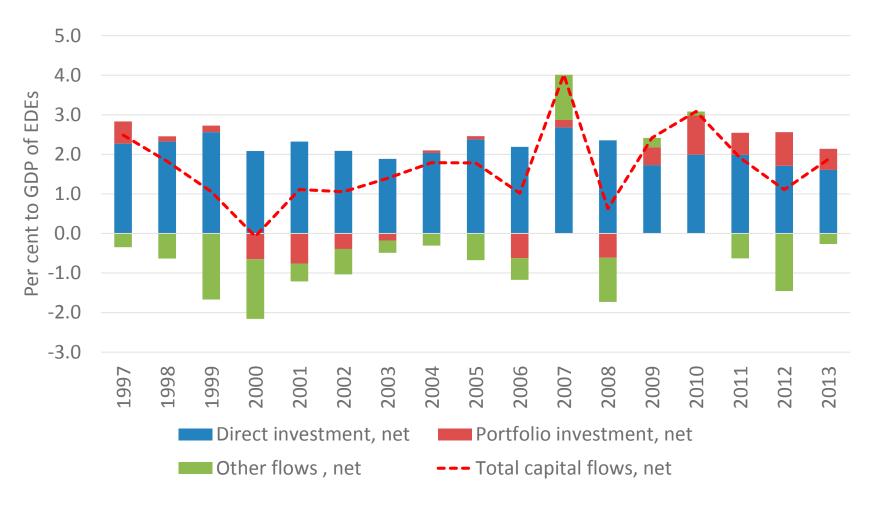
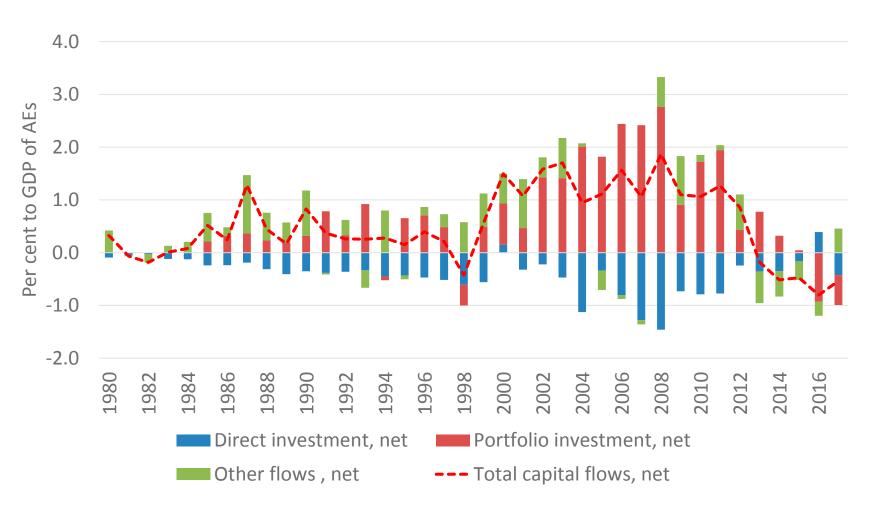

### **Chart 4 Capital Flows to EDEs and Growth**

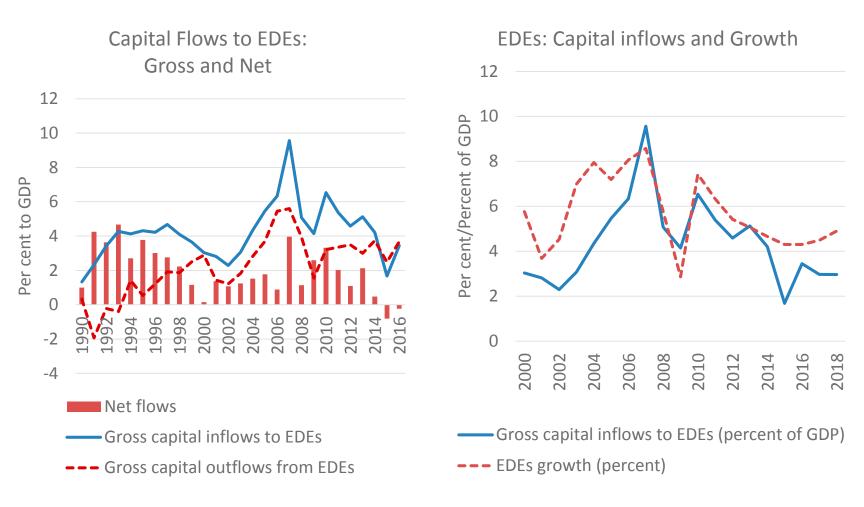

**Chart 5 Growth and Inflation in EDEs: Persistently above AEs** 

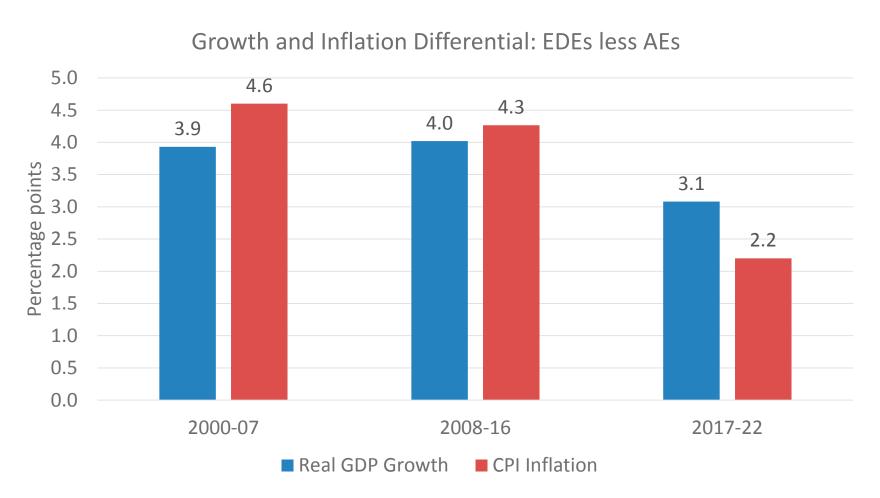
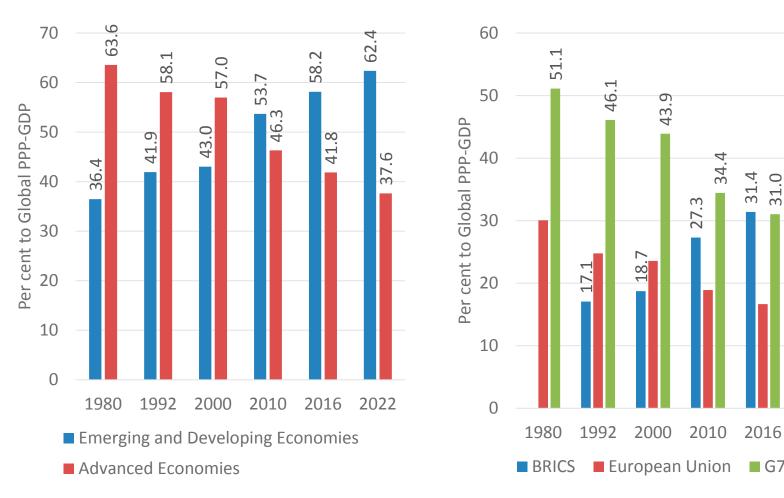

Share in Global GDP (PPP Basis)

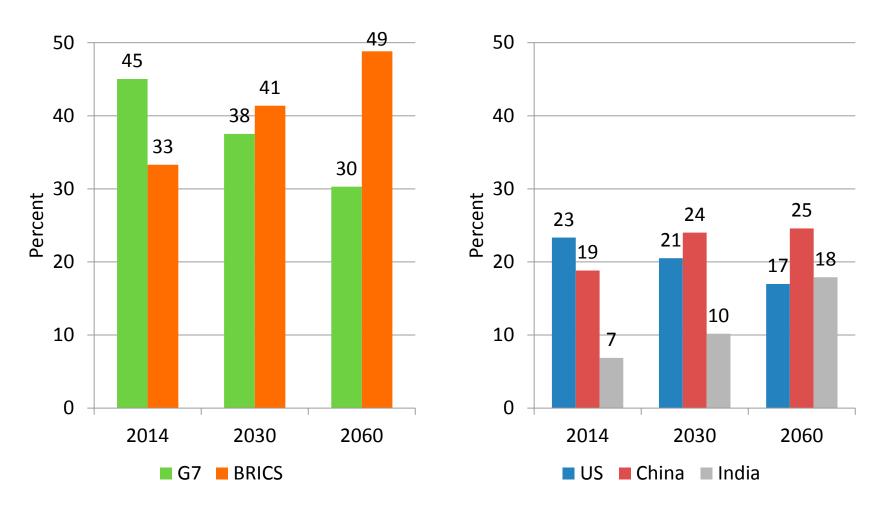

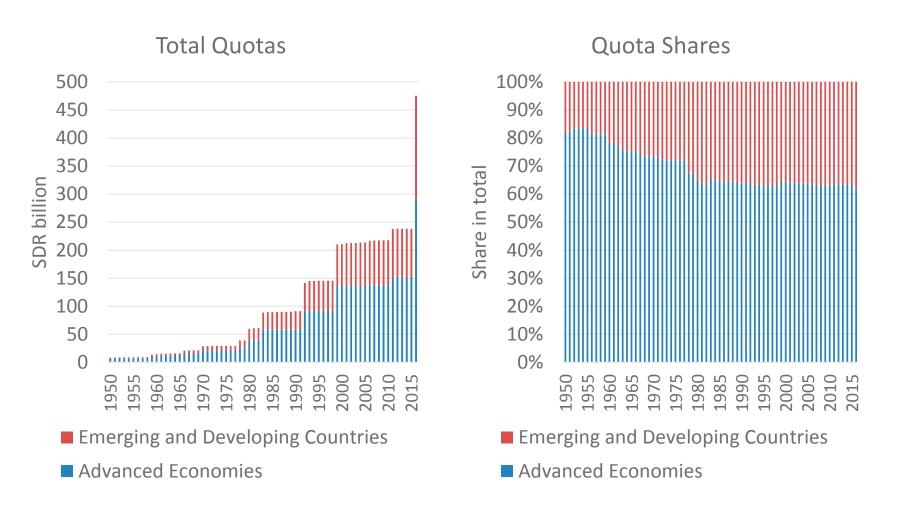

Projected Structure of the Global Economy (2014-2060)

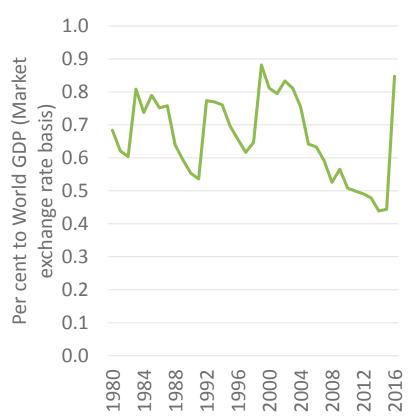


### Chart 8 International Monetary and Financial System IMF Total Quota Resources

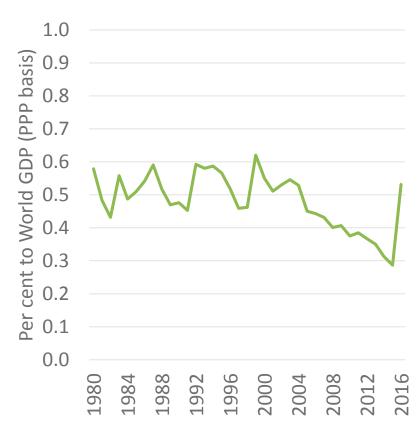


## Chart 9 International Monetary and Financial System IMF Quota Resources and GDP

### Total Quotas relative to World GDP-Market Exchange Rates

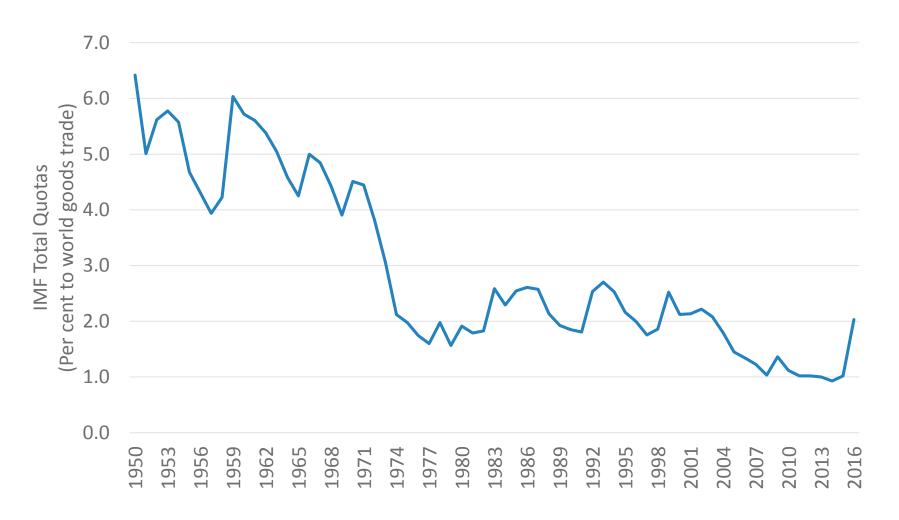


#### Total Quotas relative to World GDP-PPP
