



Mr. Chris Legg is the Executive Director representing Asia and the Pacific islands at the International Monetary Fund. Mr. Legg represents a large and diverse constituency comprised of Australia, Kiribati, Korea, Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Mongolia, New Zealand, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, Uzbekistan and Vanuatu.

Prior to joining the Executive Board of the International Monetary Fund in 2008, Mr. Legg held senior positions in the Australian Treasury, including as: Acting Executive Director (International) of Treasury's Macroeconomic Group; General Manager of Financial System Division; and General Manager of Foreign Investment Policy Division and Executive Member of Australia's Foreign Investment Review Board. He was also an Alternate Executive Director of the World Bank between 1995 and 1999.
