Joe Amoako-Tuffour is professor of economics at St. Francis Xavier University, and is currently a Senior Advisor to the African Centre for Economic Transformation. Since 2001, he has served in different capacities as policy advisor at the Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning (Ghana), including Ghana's first Poverty Reduction Strategy, developing Ghana's framework for Multi Donor Budget Support in Ghana, and during 2006-2007, he designed and set up the establishment of the Tax Policy Unit in the Ministry, and in 2008-2010 served as the leader of the technical team that developed Ghana's petroleum revenue management law. He published a book on *Poverty Reduction Strategies in Action: Lessons and Perspectives from Ghana* and has also published widely in international journals on the demand for public goods, recreational demand analysis, fiscal deficits and public debt. He is currently a member of the Oxford-based Natural Resource Charter Technical Advisory Group. His current research focuses on governance and fiscal frameworks to foster resource developments, and the links between resource revenue management and the conduct of fiscal policy. Professor Amoako-Tuffour holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Alberta, Canada and received his B.A and M.A in Economics from Simon Fraser University, Canada.
