
Figure 2.4. Model Simulations: Macroeconomic Effects of a **Commodity Boom**

The IMF's Global Economy Model predicts that a commodity price boom should induce higher investment, consumption, output, and labor effort in commodityexporting economies. The gains in output and labor effort have cyclical and structural components. The model also predicts that these economies' factors of production will shift toward the nontradables and commodities sectors and that the currency will appreciate in real terms.
