Introduction

1. At the time of the 2005 review of the Fund's transparency policy, it was agreed that information on key trends in implementation of the transparency policy would be circulated to the Executive Board regularly, along with lists indicating the publication status of reports discussed by the Board.¹ The first such report was issued in January 2006.² As foreshadowed in that paper, consistent with ongoing efforts to streamline procedures, this and subsequent reports on *Key Trends in Implementation of the Fund's Transparency Policy* are being made available to the Board only electronically.
2. The set of tables provided in this report updates the last *Key Trends* with information on documents published through December 2006.³ Rolling updates will continue to be issued annually to the Board.
