#### 4. IMF Documents Exempt from Disclosure

IMF's Transparency Policy in accordance with Executive Board Decision No. 14498 - (09/126), adopted 12/17/09 effective 03/17/10 doesn't grant access to the following material:

(a) legal documents and records maintained by the Legal Department that are protected by attorney-client privilege; (b) documentary materials furnished to the Fund by external parties, including member countries, their instrumentalities and agencies and central banks, that bear confidentiality markings, unless such external parties consent to their declassification; (c) personnel files and medical or other records pertaining to individuals; and (d) documents and proceedings of the Grievance Committee.

### 5. Reading Room Rules

The reading room is open Monday to Friday, 9:30 am to 4:45 pm. All visitors must complete and sign this form. In addition they must sign the visitors log book each day.

Personal belongings (i.e., books, papers, folders, pens, newspaper, bags, briefcases, computer cases, coats, and umbrellas) cannot be brought into the research room. Individual lockers are provided for storing personal belongings. Use of a laptop computer is permitted.

Food and beverages are not permitted in the IMF Archives and smoking is prohibited in all IMF office areas.

Researchers do not have access to the Archives Repository.

Archival material is highly fragile and vulnerable to improper handling. To minimize any damage, original documents must remain on the desk and separate from researcher's notes. Documents **must not** be marked, rearranged, removed from their covers, or taken out of the research room. Please return files to their proper

sequence in each box and make sure not to mix records from different boxes because it is vital that records remain in their proper boxes. In addition, leaving numerous files spread out on the tables is not permitted.

Use pencils and note pads provided by the Archives staff. Ink, marker pens, and post-it-notes may not be used as they can damage the records.

**Making copies:** Only digital cameras are allowed to make copies of documents. A camera stand is provided for this purpose.

Scanning of records is not allowed; we encourage visitors to bring their own flash drive or CD in order to copy electronic documents.

## 6. Notice of Warning Concerning Copyright Restrictions

The making of photocopies or other reproduction of copyrighted material may be subject to copyright law, including the U.S. Copyright Act (Title 17, U.S. Code).

Under certain conditions specified by the law, libraries and archives are authorized to furnish a photocopy or other reproduction. One of these specified conditions is that photocopy or other reproduction is not to "used for any purpose other than private study, scholarship, or research."
