The proposal is to come up, for the February 2022 BOPCOM meeting, with a better understanding of which discussion issues will (i) be taken on board in BPM7; (ii) remain on the Committee's research agenda for future work (and be mentioned in BPM7); and (iii) not be included in BPM7.</i>

	<i>This paper proposes to introduce a live updatable appendix to the revised BPM6 as work in the area of sustainable finance and understanding of data needs for addressing climate change evolves. The appendix shall include measures and indicators pertaining to the balance of payments and International Investment Position (IIP), relevant for climate change-related financial risks.</i>

	<i>This paper discusses five specific options for recording economic ownership of intellectual property products (IPP), based on the review of existing materials, and past discussions. Both the 2008 SNA and BPM6 treat IPPs (originals, license to reproduce, and copies) as produced assets. Determining economic ownership of IPPs among units of a Multinational Enterprise (MNE), and the recording of related transactions can be challenging as this affects the recording of assets and related income flows in macroeconomic statistics.</i>

	<i>This paper discusses the guidance for recording transactions related to marketing assets in both the BPM6 and the 2008 SNA. The GN presents two options for discussion, namely either (i) to revisit the treatment of marketing assets as produced non-financial assets, a topic that was already included in the SNA research agenda</i>		

	(2008 SNA, Annex 4), or (ii) to maintain the status quo in the treatment but with more appropriate and consistent recordings in both the national and international accounts.

	The consolidated paper proposes recommendations to resolve a number of issues arising from the intrinsic nature of Islamic finance and its specific provisions in the update of the 2008 SNA and BPM6. They relate to (i) classifying Islamic financial instruments underlying the various types of financing arrangements within the SNA and BPM frameworks, (ii) adopting the appropriate terminology to describe investment income for some Islamic financial instruments, (iii) the possible discussion of FISIM, (iv) sectorizing and determining how to calculate the output of some entities, which are rather unique to Islamic finance, (v) determining economic ownership of non-financial assets underlying various sales, equity and leasing arrangements under Islamic finance, and (vi) the statistical treatment of Islamic insurance and reinsurance.

It also considers the issues of informality facilitated by digitalization, as well as informal cross border flows.
